

CHS Guidelines

I. Cheerleading Program

Purpose:

It should be the purpose of the Columbia-Brazoria ISD cheerleading programs to:

- A. promote and uphold loyal school spirit throughout the year
- B. encourage good sportsmanship amongst students of CBISD
- C. improve relationships between school during athletic events
- D. positively represent CBISD in the community
- E. positively represent CBISD in sanctioned cheerleading/mascot competitions, sporting events and school activities

Objective:

It should be the objective of Columbia-Brazoria ISD cheerleading programs to promote the type of sportsmanship that will develop a cooperative spirit among student body, faculty, administration, opposing schools and the community, as well as provide students an environment to develop the attributes of good moral character and citizenship.

III. Selection Process

A. Qualifications

- 1. Candidates should be currently enrolled in CBISD or have letter of intent TO ENROLL IN A CBISD SCHOOL on file with appropriate front office.
- 2. Prospective candidates must obtain and review a tryout packet as well as submit all completed paperwork on or by the designated due dates.
- 3. All prospective candidates are subject to an administrative evaluation of academics, attendance and disciplinary records prior to being permitted to complete the tryout process.
- 4. All candidates should be available to attend summer camp in its entirety. Any exceptions must be approved by coaches and campus administration.
- 5. All candidates should attend the pre-tryout meeting or an individually arranged meeting with coaches and campus administration prior to the start of the tryout clinic.
- 6. Successful candidates must submit a physical, completed on the appropriate district document, by a medical physician, on or by the given deadline.
- 7. Further qualifications involving the tryout procedures and process, standards of conduct, participation and uniforms may be required by the coach and campus administration.
- 8. The CHS Extra-Curricular Code of Conduct will provide more specific requirements and guidelines for candidates and their parents.

IV. Member Responsibilities, ctd

Columbia High School Cheerleaders

- 1. CHS cheerleaders will be expected to attend the following:
 - a. Designated home football and basketball games
 - b. Designated pep rallies
 - c. Designated practices
 - d. Designated CHS games
 - e. Designated community events
 - f. Designated paint signs
 - g. Designated fundraiser dates

V. Conduct

- A. CBISD cheerleaders are direct, highly visible representatives of the district and are expected to conduct themselves in an exemplary manner, at all times.
 - 1. Cheerleaders should, at all times, abide by the Columbia-Brazoria ISD student code of conduct as well as the Columbia High School extra-curricular code of conduct

VII. Summer Camp

A. Attendance to summer camp, in its entirety, is expected.

VIII. Appearance

- A. Cheerleaders will maintain a neat and clean appearance at all times in identifying apparel.
- B. Uniforms and apparel should always be well kept
- C. The appropriate socks, bra, and undergarments are expected at all times. Bra straps that are not uniform pieces should not be visible.
- No gum, candy, or food while cheering at games, pep rallies, camp, practice, performance or competitions.
 No visible fingernail polish, shellac, powder or press on nails allowed while in uniform.
- E. Fingernails (natural and artificial) must be kept at safe length with a natural appearance.
- F. Visible tattoos and excessive body painting are not allowed.
- G. Hair should be pulled back and styled as assigned with correct ribbon or bow during all cheerleading practices, events and appearances.
- H. Complete uniform, as assigned, will be worn to every performance or appearance.
 - I. Absolutely no jewelry is permitted during practices, performances, or games.
- J. When worn, uniform skirt must be worn appropriately. Skirt must be buttoned and may not be rolled.
- K. Only approved articles of clothing identifying as a CBISD cheerleader may be worn over or with the uniform.
- L. Cheerleaders may not allow others to wear their cheerleading apparel.

IX. Discipline

- A. All members of a CBISD cheerleading program will be on a demerit system. The coaching staff is the ultimate authority regarding demerits.
- B. Demerits will be issued by coaching staff.
- C. Dismissal from the squad may occur, with the approval of campus administration, for any of the following:
 - 1. Accumulation of 10 demerits during one (1) cheerleading season
 - 2. Unexcused absence from summer camp
 - 3. Assignment to DAEP
 - 4. Refusal to participate in any activity that is required of the cheerleaders
 - 5. For other offenses, as deemed appropriate by campus administration
- D. Dismissal from the squad is permanent. A dismissed cheerleader will be responsible for all financial obligation incurred up to the date of dismissal.
 - E. Dismissed cheerleaders are relieved of their duties immediately upon dismissal.
 - F. Cheerleaders who have been dismissed may not be eligible for tryouts the following year.
 - G. Suspension/Benching from performance may occur as warranted and duration is dependent on the severity of the offense. Offenses resulting in suspension include, but are not limited to...

Infraction	Suspension Term
Accumulation of 7 demerits	Up to one calendar week, to include 1 game
After 7, each additional 2 demerits	Up to one calendar week, to include 1 game
Assignment to ISS	Length of term + demerits
Failing grade on report card	UIL standard + demerits incurred

- I. 1. In addition to demerits issued for infractions, the coaching staff may administer additional discipline demerits when deemed necessary.
 - 2. Failure to fulfill the obligations of additional discipline will be interpreted as insubordination and result in additional demerits.
- J. Cheerleaders may have opportunities throughout the season to earn merits.
- H. Demerits may be issued, by the coaching staff only, for behavior deemed inappropriate. Demerits may be issued for any infraction of (but not limited to) the following:

Unsportsmanlike conduct	2

Any public display of affection in identifying apparel	3
Academic dishonesty	7
Unsafe behavior during cheerleading activity	5
Sharing identifying apparel	2
Additional offenses deemed inappropriate by coaches	1+

XI. Budget and Expenses

It is the responsibility of the cheerleader to provide the funds on or before the given due dates.

Anticipated expenses may include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Camp
- 2. Competition (may include travel and lodging)
- 3. Uniform pieces
- 4. Shoes
- 5. Bows/ribbon
- 6. Accessories (megaphone, poms, bags, poncho, etc)
- 7. Warm-ups
- 8. Camp/practice apparel
- 9. Themed performance apparel

A list of anticipated expenses will be provided when materials are selected.

Apparel pieces may be withheld, or performance opportunities suspended until financial obligations have been met.

-Financial obligation- The following information is an estimated cost per cheerleader. The prices are based on 2021-2022 school year cost and are subject to change for 2022-2023 school year.

Tryout Process

Tryout Clinic

- Candidates may dress in their choice of school appropriate athletic apparel. All candidates must wear appropriate shorts, a t-shirt, and athletic shoes during the tryout clinic. Athletic shoes are required and hair should be pulled back away from the face. A SOLID ribbon or bow may be worn.
- Absolutely no jewelry will be allowed.
- All fingernails must be a natural color and no longer than the tips of the finger.

Tryouts

- Candidates must wear a solid maroon t-shirt and black shorts. Shirts and shorts may not have lettering on them, small logos are acceptable. Shorts may have minimal striping.
- Athletic shoes are expected.
- Hair should be pulled back away from the face and adorned with a plain white ribbon or bow (no lettering on bow, please).
- Absolutely no jewelry will be allowed.
- All fingernails must be a natural color and no longer than the tips of the finger.

There will be ABSOLUTELY NO parents/guardians, siblings or other students permitted in the gym during tryout week. All activities will be closed to spectators. Tryout Eligibility: In order to be deemed eligible to tryout, candidates should: - be currently enrolled in CBISD or have a letter of intent for enrollment.
